Our region and community continue to experience dramatic growth and change, and these investments for both Travis County and the State of Texas are urgently needed to protect the quality of life for ourselves and for the future. Austin Parks Foundation has created this guide to the critical park funding measures on the ballot this fall.

State of Texas: Vote **YES** on Prop 14

The proposed constitutional amendment would create the Texas Centennial Parks Conservation Fund to invest \$1 billion in new parkland for the State Parks system. Texas ranks 35th in the nation for state park acreage per capita, according to a report by Environment Texas. This historic and unprecedented level of investment comes as the Texas State Parks system celebrates its 100th anniversary this year.

Travis County: Vote **YES** on Props A and B

These are the most transformational bond investment proposals in Travis County's history. The total proposed investment is \$509.5 million, but still affordable for local taxpayers. If both bonds are approved, the maximum monthly increase in property taxes for owners of median-value Travis County homes would only be approximately \$3.76 a month.

Prop A: Proposes multi-modal transportation infrastructure investment for projects that address mobility and safety challenges. Each project prioritizes active transportation infrastructure including sidewalks, bike lanes and shared-use paths.

Prop B: Proposes investment in new and better parks, hike and bike trails, sports facilities and open spaces. Includes funds for land acquisition and conservation to help protect regional air and water quality. It is vital for our local government to invest in parks and open spaces before rapid, ongoing private land development prevents it.
