## Introduction

Founded in 2002, Austin City Limits (ACL) Music Festival presented by the Austin Parks Foundation is one of the premier destination festivals in the United States. ACL Music Festival is an 9-stage music, food and art festival that takes place on back-to-back weekends in Zilker Park, located in the heart of Austin, Texas.

In 2009, the festival promoter, C3 Presents, hired AngelouEconomics (AE) to measure the economic contributions of the ACL Music Festival to Austin. Given the longevity of the C3 Presents and AE relationship, AE can measure the cumulative impact of ACL Music Festival on the Austin economy. The following report captures the full effect of the 2023 ACL Music Festival on Austin's local economy.

The analysis includes two separate impacts:

The impact of festival operations

The impact of festival attendee expenditures

These calculations are based on data provided by C3 Presents and an extensive attendee spending survey completed by over 8,800 festival attendees.

# **Executive Summary**

The annual ACL Music Festival continues to contribute significantly to Austin's economy. The 2023 ACL Music Festival contributed **\$499.9 million** to the Austin economy, which is the equivalent of **3,766 full time jobs**. Since we began tracking economic impact in 2006, ACL Music Festival has generated over **\$3.5 billion** for the Austin economy – the equivalent of retaining **35,967 jobs** for Austin employees.

Over the last 19 years, ACL Music Festival's partnership with the Austin Parks Foundation has provided more than \$63 million to Austin's public park system. This unique relationship ensures that a portion of every ticket purchased supports parks in every corner of Austin. The 2023 ACL Music Festival alone generated \$8.1 million toward park improvements across the city. This \$8.1 million is in addition to City expenses, maintenance, and restoration of Zilker Park, which are also paid annually by ACL Music Festival.

### **Economic Impact Methodology**

#### **Economic Impact Models & Inputs**

- AngelouEconomics employed the IMPLAN (**IM**pact Analysis for **PLAN**ning) model for the analysis of the 2023 ACL Music Festival. The model utilizes multipliers specific to the Austin economy, specifically Travis County. The analysis of ACL Music Festival is comprised of two models: festival operations and attendee expenditures. The sum of these two impacts create the total economic output of the music festival.
- Festival operations data was provided by C3 Presents and were used to generate the festival operations model. The attendee expenditures model was created using inputs from survey data and assumptions estimating the amount of money spent by attendants on various categories of expenditures.



#### **Model Outputs**

Each of the models generate three different types of effects: direct, indirect and induced effects. The IMPLAN model's calculated outputs include jobs, labor income, total economic output, and state and local tax revenues.

#### **Total Economic Impacts**

- The 2023 ACL Music Festival contributed \$500.0 million to the Austin economy.
- The 2023 ACL Music Festival is responsible for 3,766 full-time job equivalents hired or sustained.
- Over \$182 million in labor incomes were paid to Austin employees as a result of ACL Music Festival.

- Top Sectors by Economic Output:
  - 1. Food & Beverage: \$111.5 million
  - 2. Hotels: \$53.9 million
  - 3. Artists & Performers: \$28.1 million
- Top Sectors by Jobs Created or Sustained:
  - 1. Food & Beverage: 1,166 jobs
  - 2. Hotels: 349 jobs
  - 3. Ground Passenger Transportation: **346 jobs**

Note: All job figures are measured as full-time job equivalents

\*Full-Time Equivalents (FTEs) is a unit of measurement that is commonly used to express the total number of employees or work hours within an organization. It is calculated by combining the number of full-time employees with the number of part-time employees who work the same number of hours as full-time employees.

#### **Festival Operation Impacts**

- Festival operations accounted for nearly \$110.3 million of the total economic impact of this year's ACL Music Festival.
- Festival operations is responsible for 736 full-time job equivalents hired or sustained.
- Over \$34.5 million in labor income were paid to Austin employees as a result of ACL Music Festival.

#### **Attendee Expenditure Impacts**

- Attendee expenditures accounted for \$389.7 million of the total economic impact of this year's ACL Music Festival.
- Attendee expenditures resulted in a total of 3,030 full-time job equivalents hired or sustained.
- Over \$147.5 million in labor income was paid to Austin employees as a result of the attendee expenditures.
- ➤ Impacts include expenditures both on-and off-site of the Austin City Limits festival grounds.








#### **Historical Impact of ACL Music Festival**

#### 18-Year Total Impact of Austin City Limits Music Festival

- Since 2006, ACL Music Festival has generated \$3.5 billion for the local Austin economy.
- ➤ In terms of full-time job equivalents, ACL Music Festival has created or sustained **35,967 jobs** for Austin employees over the last 18 years.
- The 2023 iteration created or sustained **3,766 jobs**. Each year on average, there has been a **12.1% increase** in the number of jobs created or sustained for the Austin economy because of ACL Music Festival.
- ➤ Austin City Limits is a major contributor to the Austin economy for jobs, labor income and economic output.
- ➤ The 2023 iteration contributed \$499.9 million to the Austin economy in total economic output. Each year on average, there has been a 15.1% increase in total economic impact because of ACL Music Festival.
